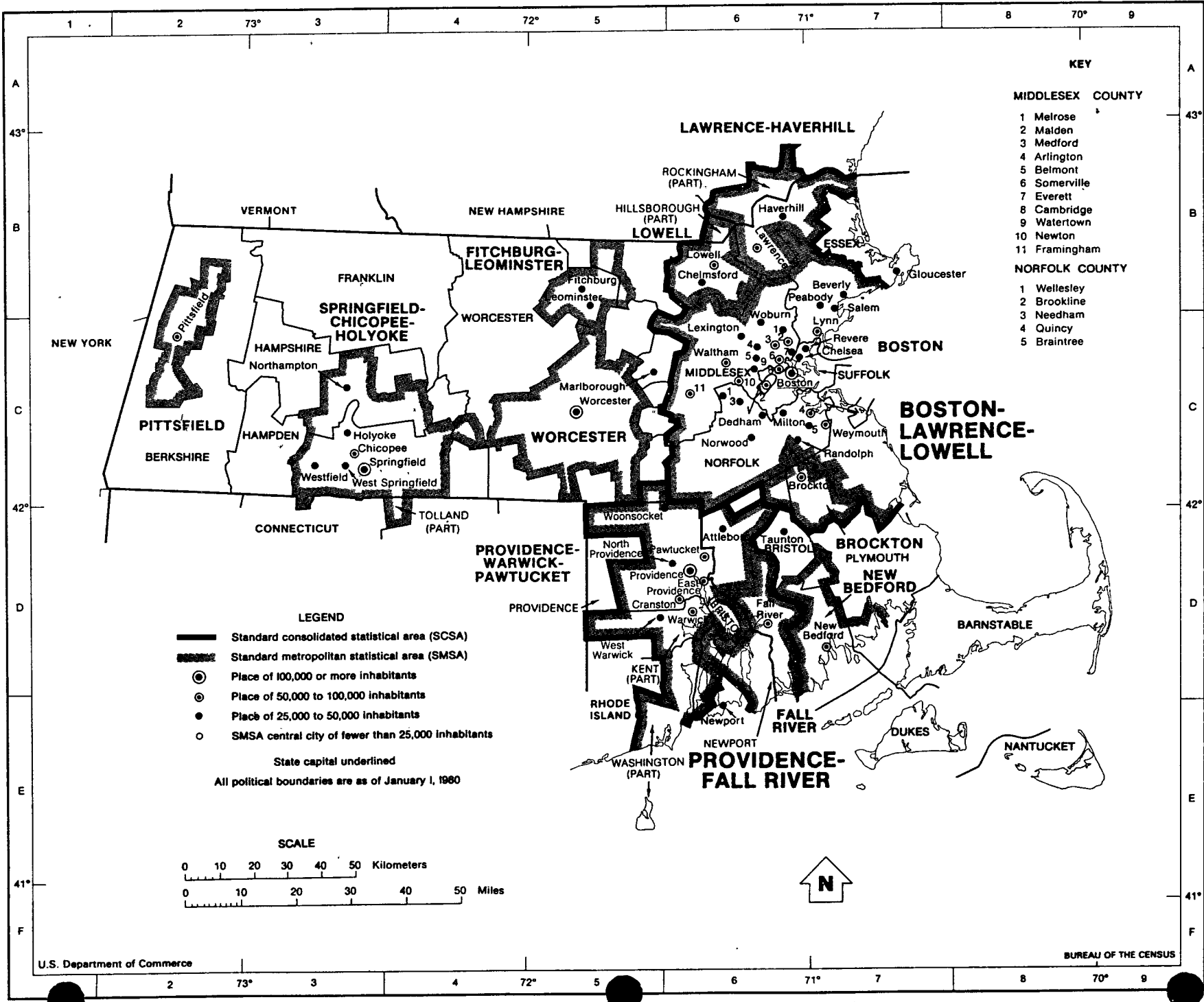


MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS

Township governments in Massachusetts are designated "towns." Unlike township governments of the Middle West, which typically provide only limited services to rural areas, many Massachusetts town governments serve heavily populated areas and perform functions ordinarily associated elsewhere with municipal governments.

MUNICIPALITIES

Massachusetts cities are established by special acts of the legislature. The minimum population requirement for incorporation as a city is 12,000. These cities exist outside the area of any town and, in addition to usual municipal functions, they have responsibility for services handled in other parts of the State by town government.

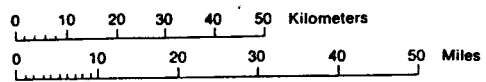
